Notes for parents

All pupils benefit from a good relationship between home and school, and at Whirley Primary School we are committed to developing such relationships. This agreement formally recognises our responsibilities. Children are invited to sign the agreement when the school and parents agree that they are sufficiently mature and understand all the rules, but all pupils will be made aware of the school's code of behaviour, and we ask that parents support this.

The school's curriculum is mainly determined by law, but we have our own agreed aims, which form the school section of this agreement and are in our prospectus. These create the ethos in which we want children to grow and flourish, and they represent our values as a school community.

Signing the agreement is voluntary and is welcomed by the staff and governors, but the absence of a signed agreement does not exempt any pupils from complying with school rules. The school will always sign its section of the agreement and abide by it.

The School will try to:

- Be open and welcoming to children and parents and work in partnership with them and the wider community.
- Recognise and provide for the needs of each child, encouraging them to achieve their maximum potential by providing challenging learning experiences.
- Foster a love of learning and develop an enquiring mind.
- Contribute to a child's spiritual, emotional, social, moral and physical development.
- Develop positive approaches and attitudes to the diverse needs of others and enable children to become responsible and active member of our multi-cultural society.

- Ensure that children arrive at school on time.
